## **Golf tourney raises nearly \$8,500**

DOVER — Twenty teams of golfers took swings for health care at The Homemakers Health Services Fourth annual Charity Care Golf Tournament held recently at Nippo Lake Golf Course. The major sponsor of this year's event was Ron Currier's Hilltop Chevrolet.



Earning first place gross honors with a score of 54, was the team from Eastern Propane comprised of Chuck Clement, IV; Cider Berry, Jeff Taylor and Meghan Clement. The team generously donated their prize money back to The Homemakers.

Shooting a 55 earned the team of Cadieux Flooring first place net honors. Members of the Cadieux Flooring team were Tom Cadieux, John Lizotte, Mike Mondeaux and Eric Nelson.

Taking second place net honors with a score of 56 were members of the Strafford County Commissioner's team Ron Chagnon, Bill Emerson, George Maglaras and Jerry McCarthy.

Making a 21'6" putt won Paul Ventre longest putt honors while longest drive honors went to Meghan Clement in the female competition and to Mike Roether in the male competition. On No. 6, Bill Benson came within 13 feet of the pin and on No. 12 Chris Shea came within three feet of the pin to win closest to the pin contest. Closest to the pin in two went to Eric Nelson who landed 4'2" away from the pin on No. 5.

Proceeds from the tournament will benefit The Homemakers' Charity Care program, which provides vital health care services to people in need throughout Strafford County.
